In our short study of this vivid book, we will see how it is NOT intended as a book about the end of the world, but about how God breaks into the current world to destroy evil and avenge the persecuted. It is a picture for ALL ages and ALL cultures. We will follow the outline below to guide us through God's pictures of bringing peace and happiness to the suffering in our current world. Please take the time to read the designated chapters in the Book of Revelation prior to coming to class each week. This will help you to prepare your minds for discussion and, probably, generate numerous questions that will help move the discussion forward.

Soloists' Biographies

Of **Indra Thomas'** performance as Imogene in *Il Pirata* at the Caramoor Festival, *The New York Times wrote:* "The mad scene was a triumph, especially its reflective first half in which Ms. Thomas' affinity for long-spun, slow melodic phrases was impressive. The audience awarded her a tremendous ovation."

Considered one of the foremost Aidas in the world today, Ms. Thomas sang this role at the Chorégies, d'Orange in a performance that was televised throughout France during the summer of 2011. For the 2011/12 season, she performed in concerts with the Rome Symphony Orchestra (Georgia), and at the Atlanta Music Festival. Further performances this season will be *Aida* at the Hamburgische Staatsoper, and a performance of Barber's *Knoxville: Summer of 1915* with the Florida

Orchestra under the direction of Stefan Sanderling. Ms. Thomas also sang at the memorial service for Maestro Dino Anagnost, music director of The Little Orchestra Society of New York, last December, and in the New Year's Eve Concert for Peace at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, where she performed Sir Michael Tippett's *A Child of Our Time*.

During the summer of 2010, Ms. Thomas sang *Aida* at the Bregenz Festival in Austria. In the 2010/11 season, she performed in a Gala Concert for the Artist Series of Sarasota, sang *Aida* at the Palau De Les Arts Reina Sofia in Valencia, Spain, made her New York recital debut in Weill Recital Hall, sang the Verdi *Requiem* with the Flint Symphony, *A Child of Our Time* with Radio France in Paris, and the Utah Symphony, and performed Chausson's *Poèms de L'amour et la Mer* with the Orquesta Sinfonica de Galicia.

During the summer of 2009, Ms. Thomas performed *Aida* in a new production at the Bregenz Festival, and Sir Michael Tippett's *A Child of Our Time* with the Netherlands Radio Philharmonic. The 2009/10 season brought performances of the Verdi *Requiem* in a tour of four cities in Spain with the Euskadi Orchestra under the direction of Andres Orozco Estrada, a special holiday concert with the Little Orchestra Society of New York, Britten's *War Requiem* with the Orchestra de Paris, the Verdi *Requiem* with the Vermont Symphony, and *Aida* at the Avignon Music Festival and the Bregenz Festival.

During the 2008/09 season, Ms. Thomas made her debut at the Teatro Real in Madrid and the

Wiener Staatsoper, as Amelia in Un Ballo in Maschera. She sang in a gala concert in Abu Dhabi to open the Abu Dhabi Classics Festival which was hosted by Jeremy Irons, performed in a Christmas concert with the Vermont Symphony, and sang a concert of Gershwin songs and operatic arias in Istanbul. In addition, there was a Verdi Requiem the Lahti Symphony in Finland, and performances of the Beethoven Symphony No. 9 with the Seoul Philharmonic Orchestra in Seoul, South Korea, and the Missa Solemnis with the Yomiuri Nippon Symphony Orchestra in Tokyo. Ms. Thomas sang works by Gershwin and Barber with the Cincinnati Chamber Orchestra, performed a concert of opera arias with the Cleveland Symphony, and sang Beethoven's Symphony No. 9 with the Malaysia Symphony Orchestra. Atlanta-born soprano, **Ann Marie McPhail** one of the regions most seasoned performers and is quickly establishing herself as a versatile lyric soprano in the United States. She is a 1st place winner of the *American Traditions Competition* and *The Rose Palmai Tenser Competition*. Other accolades include singing "Diva Goddess" in the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games, Closing Ceremonies in Atlanta, Georgia. Her credits include opera singer in Tyler Perry's movie, For Colored Girls and Strawberry Woman in the Atlanta Opera's 2010 production of Gershwin's Porgy and Bess for which she received

mention in *Opera News*. She has recently returned from Copenhagen, Denmark where she covered the role of Clara in *Porgy and Bess* with the Royal Danish

This Spring she will be in concert April 16, 2015 with the Atlanta Chamber Players at the Ray Charles Performing Arts Center and will premiere a work by composer Mark Gresham. Mezzo-Soprano, Pamela Dillard., a native of Atlanta, Georgia is a professor of voice at Spelman College in Atlanta. She earned her B.F.A. from Newcomb College of Tulane University where she received a Thomas J. Watson Fellowship, which provided her a year of travel and study in Europe. She was the recipient of the Martin Luther King Graduate Fellowship at Boston University, where she received her M.M.

Dillard made her professional operatic debut as Irina in Kurt Weil's Lost in the Stars with Boston Lyric Opera staged by dancer/choreographer Bill T. Jones. She returned to BLO as Ursula in Béatrice and Bénédict and Meg Page in Falstaff. Dillard made her debut with San Francisco Opera as Victoire in the world premiere of The Dangerous Liaisons (telecast nationally for Great Performances on PBS). She returned to San Francisco Opera to sing roles in Rusalka, Carmen and Manon Ms.

Dillard caught the international attention of critics for her stunning portrayal of the title role in Opera Theatre of Saint Louis' production of Offenbach's La Belle Hélène. She also appeared as Meg Page in Falstaff and Suzuki in Madama Butterfly for OTSL.

Dillard's most recent engagements include a patriotic concert with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra during their summer concert series; singing Bess in a concert performance of Gershwin's Porgy and Bess with Plano Symphony in Plano, Texas; repeating the role of Lily in Porgy and Bess and Third Lady in The Magic Flute both for Atlanta Opera; and Grimgerde in Wagner's Die Walküre with San Francisco Opera..

On the concert stage, Ms. Dillard has appeared with symphonies across the United States including, The Brooklyn Philharmonic, Boston Symphony Orchestra, Cobb Symphony Orchestra, Saint Louis Symphony, Colorado Symphony, New Haven Symphony, Pacific Symphony and Marin Symphony Orchestras among others. Her debut with Atlanta Symphony Orchestra was as the featured soloist in Alexander Nevsky, returning the following season to sing the title role in Bizet's Carmen. She was presented in concert with the Boston Pops Orchestra in a tribute concert to the centenary of the birth of Marian Anderson. She has sung under the baton of great conductors such as, Grammy nominated composer John Williams, Seiji Ozawa, Keith Lockhart, Donald Runnicles, Robert Spano and Yoel Levi.

Ms. Dillard can be heard on Watch and Pray, Spirituals and Art Songs by African American Women Composers produced by Koch International Classics. Other recordings include the featured soloist for the Grammy nominated soundtrack to Stephen Spielberg's Amistad; William Grant Still's Highway One for Visionary Records; Superhero for Brian McKnight and Preschool Favorites by Music For Little People.

Marcus O. Hill, baritone and native of Atlanta, Georgia, is studied Voice with Uzee Brown, Jr. at Morehouse College and now, Sharon Stephenson. In the United States and abroad, Marcus has performed in many of the worlds most famous Churches, Theatre's and Opera Houses; some of which are the Opera-Comique in Paris, France; The Alhambra in Granada, Spain; Theatre Di Caen in Caen, Normandy; The Grand Theatre in Luxembourg; Oprah Winfrey's Leadership Academy for Girls in South Africa, and many more in South Africa, Europe, and throughout America. As a past member of the world-renowned Morehouse College Glee Club and recipient of the coveted Presidential Scholarship in Music, Marcus has performed with MCGC in South Africa where he sang Handel's Rejoice, O Judah to Hallelujah Amen from Judas Macabeus. Also, with the Atlanta Opera Chorus in Paris as one of the soloist in the Funeral Scene in Gershwin's *Porqy* and *Bess* in 2008. Marcus has been seen as Dancairo in scenes from Carmen, Douglas Moore's Ballad of Baby Doe, Verdi's Il Trovatore, Alan Menken's *Little Shop of Horrors* and the Captain Steven Paulus' The Three Hermits. He premiered the role of Ndaka in Sharon Willis' Three *Kings and a Prince* and recorded the role of Smokey in the New Opera's The Kitty who lost its Meow. Marcus is also a longtime member of Atlanta's Y.E.A. where he's been seen in Soweto, Soweto, Soweto, a Township is Calling, Times, Urban Soup, and excerpts from Jekonni's Song and the famed Atlanta Symphony Orchestra Chorus. Marcus has participated in master classes with Daniel Washington, George Shirley, Donnie Ray Albert, and is coached by Walter Huff. Marcus is a member of NANM and the Atlanta Chapter MAMA, on the advisory board of the Atlanta Collegiate Artist Association (ACAA), and a past Southern advisor to the Collegiate Division of NANM.
