For God's creation is not done.


We are called to pioneer a future yet unnamed.

#### Biographical Sketch

Scott, a life-long member of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), was born in Shelbyville, Illinois, grew up in Edinburg, Illinois, and graduated from Eureka College (class of 1977).



He earned his master's degree from Illinois State University (1979) and served as a psychology professor at Eureka College for ten years (1979-1989). Scott did doctoral work in psychology at Indiana University.

After teaching at Eureka, he served as a parish minister, church fund raiser and computer consultant before he moved to full-time Regional church ministry in early 1992.

After nearly 30 plus years as Associate Regional Minister, Scott "retired" to serve as the full time interim senior minister at First Christian Church in Springfield, Illinois. He retired from full time parish ministry in January of 2023.

He has served as a helper, pastor, and resource person to congregations throughout Illinois. He worked with many congregations on visioning and planning. He led Transformation Ministries, Leadership Development, and Disciples Men's Ministry.

Scott has specialized training and serves in these areas of ministry –
Healthy Congregations Ministry – family systems theory & church life
Christian Coaching Ministry – faith-based life coaching
Interim Ministry – helping congregations in transitional times

Scott currently serves as the Director of Disciples Interims at Disciples Home Missions, our denominational group that works with churches and leaders in transitions. They offer training, support and connections for ministers, congregations, and Regions.

Scott lives in Decatur, Illinois, is married to Vicky Logan Woolridge and has two daughters, Allison and Shalon. Scott and Vicky are the proud grandparents of Harrison and Millie. Scott enjoys baking, reading, building furniture, working on his old house and helping others with their home improvements.


